1. Freedom and Solidarity Guided Walk

Date: December, 1

Start: 17:00 (2,5h)

Meeting point: Monument to the Fallen Shipyard Workers of 1970

Maximum number of participants per tour: 20

Stroll through the historic shipyard with a guide who will bring to life the events leading to the fall of communism, then step inside the European Solidarity Centre for a quick yet inspiring visit. 2. Gothic Heart of the City

Date: December, 1

Start: 17:00 (2,5h)

Meeting point: The Green Bridge

Step inside the majestic St Mary's Basilica and climb its 409 steps—there is no elevator—to reach the tower's viewing platform and admire a breathtaking panorama. With inspiring tales and spectacular views, this tour captures the very soul of Gdansk.







3. Legends and Stories of the City
