HOW TO REACH GDAŃSK:

It is possible to reach Gdańsk by train, by ferry, by bus or by plane.

The nearest airport is: **Gdańsk Lech Walesa Airport** (<http://www.airport.gdansk.pl/>).

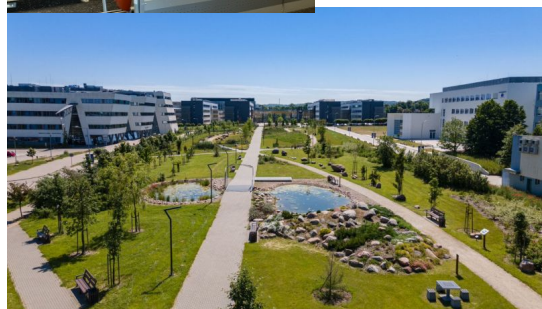
There is also a possibility to departure in Warsaw and continue the trip to Gdańsk by train (<http://www.intercity.pl/pl/>).

HOW TO GET TO THE VENUE:

Connections in a Tricity (Gdańsk, Sopot, Gdynia) can be found in <http://trojmiasto.jakdojade.pl>.

To find connection from Airport to University you should write **A:** Gdańsk Lech Walesa Airport, while **B:** Gdańsk Strzyża. You can use two options:

Option 1:

FIRST: Pomorska Kolej Metropolitarna (PKM) (direction: Gdańsk Wrzeszcz)
 Get on: Gdańsk Port Lotniczy Station – Get off Gdańsk Strzyża Station

NEXT: Walk to the Faculty of Chemistry according to map presented below.

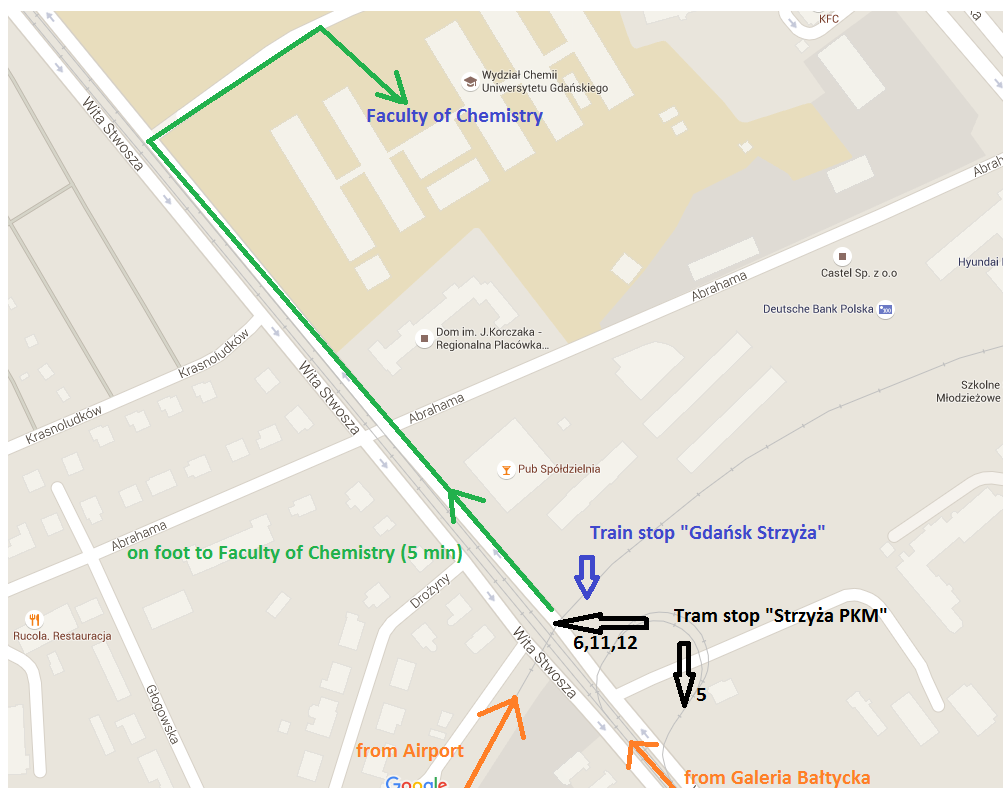
Option 2:

FIRST: Bus 110 (direction: Wrzeszcz PKP), Get on: Gdańsk Port Lotniczy Station, Get off: Galeria Bałtycka

NEXT: Take Tram No 6, 12, 11 or 5. Get on: Galeria Bałtycka tram stop, Get of: Strzyża PKM. Then walk to the Faculty of Chemistry as presented below.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN GDAŃSK

Using public transport in Gdańsk is relatively easy and convenient, with a well-developed system of buses, trams, and trains. Here's a guide on how to use public transport in Gdańsk:

1. Types of Public Transport

- **Trams:** Gdańsk has an extensive tram network that connects different districts of the city. Trams are especially useful for traveling within the central areas.
- **Buses:** Buses complement the tram network, reaching areas that are not served by trams. They also provide a more flexible way to travel around the city.
- **SKM (Szybka Kolej Miejska) and PKM (Pomorska Kolej Metropolitalna):** These are rapid train services that connect Gdańsk with neighboring cities like Gdynia and Sopot (SKM) and the airport (PKM). It is especially useful for traveling between the cities in the Tri-City area.

2. Tickets

Ticket options: You can buy a variety of tickets depending on your travel needs. Available options include single tickets (you can travel with the particular one line of the bus or tram until the end-stop of its route, without the time limit), time-based tickets (you can travel with unlimited number of busses and/or trams for up to 75 minutes), and longer-term tickets like: daily, weekly, or monthly passes.

Tickets (for bus and tram) in Gdańsk (ZTM Gdańsk)

Ticket Type	Full Fare (PLN)	Reduced Fare (PLN)
Single Ride	4,8	2,4
75-Minute Ticket	6	3
24-Hour Ticket	22	11

Ticket machines: Tickets can be purchased from ticket machines, which are available at tram/bus stops and on board some trams and buses. The machines usually accept both cash (coins) and card payments.

Mobile app: You can also buy tickets through the Gdańsk Transport Mobile App (e.g., mPay or SkyCash). The app allows you to purchase and store tickets on your phone.

Ticket inspectors: **Make sure to have a valid ticket before boarding as non-uniformed ticket inspectors frequently check tickets on public transport. If you're caught without a valid ticket, you may face a fine.**

3. How to Travel

Validity of tickets: After buying a ticket, remember to validate it by either stamping it in a machine on board or activating it on your phone if you're using an app. If you've bought a time-based ticket, you don't need to stamp it each time, just make sure it's activated.

Routes and schedules: You can check routes and schedules using online services or apps. Most trams and buses follow fixed schedules, and there are regular updates to help you plan your journey efficiently. We recommend you the website: <https://www.trojmiasto.pl/ztm/>

4. Transfers

If you need to transfer between a bus and a tram, or vice versa, make sure your ticket covers the journey. A time-based ticket (for 75 minutes) typically allows you to switch between buses and trams within the validity period.

5. Using Suburban train (SKM - Szybka Kolej Miejska)

SKM is ideal for traveling to neighboring cities like Gdynia and Sopot, but also to other districts in Gdańsk. Tickets for SKM/PKM can be bought at ticket machines at stations or via the mobile app. Ensure that you check the timetable and buy your ticket before boarding. Please, note that you need to buy a separate ticket for the SKM/PKM and cannot travel on the same tickets you purchased for the bus/tram.

6. Using Pomeranian Metropolitan Railway (PKM - Pomorska Kolej Metropolitalna)

You can buy the PKM ticket from the conductor of the train or in the machine at the station.

The Pomorska Kolej Metropolitalna (PKM, 'Pomeranian Metropolitan Railway'), is a railway in the Tricity area connecting Gdańsk Lech Wałęsa Airport with Wrzeszcz (District of Gdańsk). The railway line was constructed on the right-of-way of a pre-war line from Stara Piła to Wrzeszcz. At its northern end, the line connects with the existing, not electrified line to Gdynia, via Gdańsk Osowa and Wielki Kack. An advantage of re-opening this connection is that no buildings have had to be torn down, as the right-of-way of the old line is undisturbed and has not been encroached on anywhere.

While many people in Gdańsk speak English, the information on timetables and routes is mainly in Polish. Using an app or translation tool can be helpful if you don't speak Polish.

9. Currency

Poland has its own currency which is Polish Zloty (PLN). The average rate is: 1 PLN = 0,24 EUR. Credit/debit cards are widely accepted, however you can easily exchange money in various currency exchange desks/shops (in Polish: KANTOR) or withdraw cash from the cash machines.
