

Streamlining the CMS Quality Measurement Portfolio

■ Finalized the <u>Adult and Pediatric Universal Foundation</u> measure sets, along with <u>add-on sets</u> for maternity care, hospitals, and the post-acute care





Advancing Health Equity

- Increased number of equity-focused measures across CMS programs
- Provided more confidential feedback reporting to measured entities
- Implemented <u>Rewarding Excellence for Underserved Populations (REUP)</u> across multiple programs
- Continued discussions on standard approach to data collection and stratification approaches
- Mandated stratification of <u>Medicaid & CHIP Core Set measures</u>
- Advanced Medicaid & CHIP data imputation and publication of equity <u>data</u> <u>briefs</u>

Addressing Maternal Morbidity and Mortality

- Released 'Birthing-Friendly' designation
- Began data reporting for the <u>Severe Obstetric Complications (eCQM)</u> measure in Hospital Inpatient Quality Reporting (HIQR) Program
- Provided resources through the <u>Improving Postpartum Care Learning Collaborative</u> and <u>the toolkit on Increasing Access, Quality, and Equity in Postpartum Care in Medicaid & CHIP</u>
- Announced Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the new <u>Transforming Maternal Health</u> (TMaH) Model for state Medicaid agencies
- Announced 2024 CMS Medicaid & CHIP Maternal and Infant Health Initiative (MIHI) Learning Collaboratives for:
 - Maternal Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder
 - Maternal Hypertension and Cardiovascular Health

Promoting Engagement of Individuals and Communities to Become Partners in Their Care

- Developed and implemented more person-reported experience and outcome measures
- Collaborated with AHRQ on Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (<u>CAHPS</u>)
- Continued engagement with Medicare providers through Quality Improvement Organizations (QIO) program and increased state engagement with Medicaid & CHIP QI initiatives
