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North Campus

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Eacilities

Operations Building 1

(with Central Utility Plant #1 + Parking Garage + Multi-Purpose Facility)

Opened: May 2022

Seats: 1,388 Training Seats: 414

World-class operational facility with a strong "headquarters" posture that will focus on producing actionable intelligence for field investigations. Currently working through fit-out and security accreditation. Over ten Divisions are slated to move into the space during the month of June. Ribbon cutting expected this fall.





Innovation Center

(with Central Utility Plant #2) Opening: Spring 2024

Seats: 365 Training Seats: 758

Recently finished design and installed the last structural steel beam. Construction is currently on track and once opened, be a state-of-the-art facility dedicated to training, cyber threat intelligence, and data analytics. Anticipate 300 students per week training throughput.



Health, Wellness, Resiliency Center

Opened: March 2022

On-site employee campus amenities that support resiliency and fit-for-duty requirements. Includes: fitness center, pavilion and employee resources.



Technology Building 2+3

(with Parking Garage #2 and #3)

Opening: Fall 2026

Seats: 1,080 Training Seats: 198

The design-build procurement is underway and an award is anticipated in early September. Tech 2 will enable the movement of data via state-of-the-art networks and focuses on collecting and cleaning data, all while providing technical expertise and support to FBI Operations. Tech 3 will be an innovative hub that includes the creation of tools and applications that enhances the ability to harvest and triage case data.



NS&I CoE

Opening: Fall 2026 Training Seats: 350

National Security & Intelligence Center of Excellence. Primary research and development building for emerging security tradecraft technologies. Includes dedicated and shared spaces for collaborative research to allow for efficient technology advancement and knowledge sharing.



Opened: March 2022_ Seats: 330 Training Seats: 17

Recently completed on March 31, 2022. Staff are currently moving into space to set up computer network defense through the 24x7 monitoring of the FBI's enterprise networks + selected high risk assets.



Forensic District

Opened: 2010 – 2022 Seats: 300

Multi-agency center coordinating bomb-related evidence and intelligence collection for the US government. Experts analyze IED devices both in the US and internationally, supporting law enforcement, the intelligence community, military, border protection, and science and technology partners. Includes certified laboratory space.





In FY23, our goal was for 33% of all spend to be primed with small businesses. We spent 54% of all FY23 spend with small business, exceeding that goal.

- We typically plan for a **6-month** timeline
- Competitive and complex acquisitions can extend typical timelines

OSAT Acquisition Example Timeline

- Customer Requirement Final Development (MRR, Industry Days, IGCE): 45+ days
- Develop Acquisition Strategy for Solicitation (to include required approvals): 30-45 days
- Release Solicitation on GPE Site: 25-30 days
- Review/Evaluate Proposals (to include security): 30+ days
- Determine Award/Notify Vendor (successful and unsuccessful notifications): 10 days
- Contract Kick Off and/or Contract Transition: 15-30 days

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Vendor Engagement Team (VET)

The VET is a group that is focused on helping vendors interact and engage with the FBI. We do this by leveraging Biz.FBI.gov to collect unsolicited proposals, capability statements, schedule product demos, and facilitate meet and greets with vendors and FBI Program Managers.


