Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 USC §794d)

Section 508 passed in 1998, requires information communications technology (ICT) that is **procured**, **developed**, **maintained**, or **used** by federal agencies:

- Must be accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities
- Public and federal employees accessing government ICT
- Revised in 2018
- 2021 Federal Acquisition Regulation Part 39 adopted new guidelines (FAR)

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the Rehabilitation Act, same thing right?

Americans with Disabilities Act


- All <u>areas</u> of public life and private life open to the public must be accessible
- Both laws prohibit discrimination
- Applies to all levels of government, nonprofits, and businesses
- Recent 2024 ruling addresses ICT in the state and lower levels of government

Rehabilitation Act and Section 508

- Federal government and federal-funded programs applicability only
- Section 508 strictly applies to information communications technology (ICT) bought, used, and maintained



What is ICT anyways?





You say you are accessible, but are you really?

Project Conformance Checklist Did you complete the Procuring Section 508 Conformant ICT Products and Services training and obtain a certification of completion? ✓ Proof of completion is part of the required documentation for Section 508 review. Training can be found at Section 508 Procurement Training Is an Accessibility Conformance Report (ACR) available for each product and has it been evaluated and deemed conformant with the IHS accessibility requirements? ✓ During market research it is imperative all products' conformance state be identified and the most accessible product is chosen. Refer vendors to https://section508.gov/sell for guidance on using ACRs and the Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (∀PAT™). Alternatively, the Department of Health and Human Services has an HHS checklist that can be used to attest to Section 508 conformance. Copy and paste the updated Department of Health and Human Services Acquisition Regulation (HHSAR) Section 508 provision (solicitation) and clause (contract) into contracting documents. ✓ A Section 508 and Accessibility Requirements section must be included in the documentation to cover the entire project. Follow the instructions listed on the HHS Acquisition Requirements website to include Has the IHS Section 508 Program Manager been engaged? ✓ Engage the Section 508 Program Manager early in the contracting and project lifecycle to ensure compliance is being met. The Project Lifecycle



Shifting Section 508 to the left

- Bake into your processes early (costlier later)
- Support current and future users with disabilities



X Before

Medicaid: Apply if you are aged (65 years old or older), blind, or disabled and have low income and few resources. Apply if you are terminally ill and want to receive hospice services. Apply if you are aged, blind, or disabled; live in a nursing home; and have low income and limited resources. Apply if you are aged, blind, or disabled and need nursing home care, but can stay at home with special community care services. Apply if you are eligible for Medicare and have low income and limited resources.

✓ After

You may apply for Medicaid if you are:

- Terminally ill and want hospice services
- Eligible for Medicare and have low income and limited resources
- 65 years old or older, blind, or disabled and have low income and few resources and:
 - Live in a nursing home
 - Need a nursing home care but can stay at home with special community care services

All that you need to know about accessible fonts

Sans-serif or non-serif recommended such as:

 Arial, Calibri, Helvetica, Trebuchet MS, Verdana, Open Sans

Serif fonts (no-no):

 Times New Roman and Century

No italic, handwriting, script, novelty fonts

Font size 12 body, 24 point for titles, 18 point for headings, 1.5 line spacing


