## WHAT is the opportunity and WHY apply

Canada is Associated with Pillar 2, which is organized into 6 clusters. These calls are top-down, requiring medium to large multipartner projects. TRL level 2-8 projects are eligible.



This an excellent opportunity for Canadian researchers to collaborate with European researchers and researchers around the globe on projects for global challenges addressing Sustainable Development Goals.


#### WHO is eligible for EU funding

Min. 3 independent collaborators from 3 different institutions

- At least 1 from a EU member state Usually Coordinating
   Centre & Lead
- At least 2 in a different member state or Associated country
- Average Consortia (Team) is 12 members \*fit for purpose\*

\* Up to 5 years after the end of the project


## HOW to apply and find a consortium

Applying involves several months (3 to 6 months) of intensive prep **before** the call opens :

1. Identify a suitable call



• Found on the <u>Funding and Tenders Portal</u>, use filters to select specific topics that are of interest



- 2. Reach out for assistance
- Connect with National Contacts Points (<u>NCPs</u>).
   <u>Canada's NCPs</u>
  - Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISED) <u>Horizon Europe website</u>
  - Consult the topic page on the <u>Funding and Tenders</u>
     <u>Portal</u>. Used to publish call updates
- 3. Join or set up a consortium

3. Create an EU

profile

- Leverage your network to join a consortium
- Partner Search Tool: organizations that participated in past calls and published partner search announcements.
- <u>EU Funding & Tenders Portal</u>: to publish your partner requests or offer expertise
- **EURAXESS Partnering Portal** to find partners and/or organizations and/or to be found as a partner
- Enterprise Europe Network and Enterprise Europe Network Canada: world's largest network for SMEs and innovation stakeholders.
- **CORDIS**: database of funded consortia; pitch your strengths to funded consortia for joining their next iteration
- <u>COST platform</u>: intergovernmental framework with 40 member countries
- Each team member must create an account via <u>EU login</u> <u>platform</u>.
- Participant Identification Code (PIC) set up by institution. Reach out to central Research Office

# 5. Write a proposal

Proposal is divided into:

- Part A Application Form: data on participants, budget, Gender Equality Plans, Ethics and Security, other questions (if any). Filled in directly online
- Part B Technical Description scored on 3 criteria:
   <u>Excellence</u>, <u>Impact</u>, <u>Quality</u>. Template downloaded from Portal and re-uploaded
  - 45-50 pg for single-stage calls; 10 pg pre-proposal and 45 pg full proposal for two-stage calls.
  - Annexes: e.g., Clinical Trials; Financial support to third parties.

# 6. Review and submit

- Submit to your research office for review.
- Applications <u>MUST</u> meet all Expected Outcomes and outputs of the call description. Read and Address the Expected Outcomes very carefully.
- Submitted electronically via Funders & Tenders Portal
- Submission must contain all mandatory annexes and supporting documents.
- Attach consortium agreement.

#### SELECTION CRITERIA

Checked for formal requirements (e.g., eligibility and admissibility)

committee of independent experts:
1) Operational Capacity
(Annex C)
2) Award Criteria
(Annex D)

Evaluated by

Ranked by score. If individual threshold & the overall threshold\* passed, considered for funding, within available budget.

\*Each criterion is scored out of 5 (the score for 'Impact' is 1.5 for 'Innovation action' projects). The <u>individual criteria threshold is 3</u>. <u>The overall threshold is 10</u> (sum of the three individual scores)

For two-stage calls, successful pre-proposals will be invited to 'grant preparation'. Invitation to the grant preparation stage does **NOT** constitute a formal commitment to funding. Various legal checks are still needed before awarded.
