National Parks in Korea

A Total of 23 National Parks

23 sites 6,881 km²

60% terrestrial areas, 40% marine areas



- ✓ Home to **23,774** species
 - 40.9% of Korea's recorded biodiversity



- ✓ 40 million annual visitors
 - Explore its natural wonders and culture



- **⋖ 895** designated cultural heritage sites
 - 44 National Treasures, 74 Natural Monuments


