2020 to 2022: Covid Pandemic Recovery

- ➤ Tourism Crisis Response and Recovery Advisory Committee comprising government representatives, including the Director of Public Health, and private sector stakeholders. Tourism sector policy advice and information was then fed into the National Disaster Management Committee.

- Safe Business Operations (SBO) Training Program
- √ mandatory industry training across all sectors to ensure workplace compliance with the health and safety protocols for Covid-19.
- ✓ Training workshops and awareness sessions were delivered across all 6 provinces
- Tourism Business Support Program (TBSP)
- based on a comprehensive tourism business survey and analysis.
- Provided financial support and technical assistance for eligible tourism businesses (license, permit, ST Code) to survive the pandemic's impacts.
- Agritourism Support Program
- encourages diversification and resilience by integrating agriculture and tourism products.
- To create a point of difference with Vanuatu's local cuisine and increase the use of local, sustainable, and organic produce within the tourism industry

Tourism Support for Ministry of Climate Change Policy

Tourism Association Reps provide input into Climate Risk and Vulnerability Assessment (CRVA) and the development of a National Adaptation Plan (NAP) in partnership with the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI), and other partners, funded through the Green Climate Fund (GCF).

Vanuatu Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction Policy 2016–2030 The objective to build a sustainable and climate-resilient Vanuatu. Infrastructure projects that protect against climate impacts are also being prioritized to safeguard the nation's development goals.
