In 2020, Saskatchewan agriculture exports were the largest on record, with total international sales of \$16.9 billion. In 2020, Saskatchewan exported more than \$1.7 billion in each of our four key crop product sectors: cereal grains, oilseeds, pulses and edible oils. The new crop update would cover the market outlooks and demand for wheat, durum, oats, lentils and peas.
