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

Children are natural born engineers where the function of education at that stage is to exploit their curiosity, and unleash their creativity, to enjoy learning and being aware of it. This has been observed in the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) curriculum by introducing engineering as an essential part of the education process. Recent studies have demonstrated that introducing the STEM method at an early age supports learning of literacy and numeracy. Dr. Carol O'Donnell	Dr. Carol O'Donnell is Executive Director of the Smithsonian Science Education Center, an organization of the Smithsonian dedicated to transforming K- 12 Education through Science™ in collaboration with communities across the globe. In this role, Carol serves as the US representative on the Inter Academy Partnership Science Education Program Global Council.	Using STEM Education to Develop Young Children's Sustainability Mindsets	In this session, She will discuss how to integrate social and emotional learning, inquiry-based STEM education, and civic engagement using the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as a curricular framework for helping young children ages 5-9 use the processes of science to positively impact their community. Education is a crucial part of the SDGs, not only due to its role as a specific goal (Goal 4: Quality Education), but also because it is essential to the possibility of progress on all goals. To demonstrate how to use STEM Education for Sustainable Development (STEM4SD), I will draw on the Smithsonian Science Education Center's Smithsonian Science for Global Goals project (ssec.si.edu/global-goals) and our research on how to inspire student action-taking. I will share free curricular resources, teaching tools, and our "Global Goals Action Progression" learning framework to help education leaders develop children's "Sustainability Mindsets." This program takes a transdisciplinary approach to learning by drawing on diverse perspectives from global professionals working on these issues in their communities, and it challenges young children to examine complex SDG topics through social, environmental, economic, and ethical lenses that are developmentally appropriate.
