

Building/concept description:

Designed as a space where new research and state-of-the-art technologies and treatments are to be presented, this virtual 600 ft by 400 ft conference centre hosts the 2021 Diabetes Canada/CSEM Professional Conference.

The centre's structure is comprised of 100 large mass timber columns and trusses, symbolizing the 100th anniversary of the discovery of insulin—the only effective treatment today for type 1 diabetes—and now symbolically serving as the support and foundation on which the conference centre and research are built today.



The integration of natural materials such as wood and natural daylight into the project were an essential part of the design process, ensuring the health and well-being of both the environment and its users. Showcasing the design and sustainable approach to large-scale wood buildings, the centre acts as a development forward into the new and forthcoming technologies/treatments of the future by offering a welcoming environment for all.
