Residents in England aged 16 and over can apply for an Apprenticeship. To start an Apprenticeship, you need to be living in the UK, have 3 years or more residency and not be in full-time education.

We offer Apprenticeships in the following areas:

Engineering

We offer a wide range of engineering qualifications. Most of our engineering training is in the maintenance field where you are required to fault find, repair systems or perform part of a process.

Business Skills

Apprentices are required to work a minimum of 30 hours a week (maximum 40 hours) and will take at least one year to complete, with advanced and higher qualifications requiring up to four years to achieve completion.

Apprenticeships are an excellent opportunity to gain qualifications specific to the industry you want to progress in, all whilst earning a wage and gaining experience. At the same time, you are working on-the-job alongside experienced staff who will train and support you on a day-to-day basis, with training for your qualification being delivered by IPS, either in your workplace or at one of our training centres.
