

Joint-Africa-EU Strategy

Adopted in 2007, strategic roadmap with multiannual action plans on defined priority areas

High-Level Policy Dialogue (HLPD) on STI

Official bi-annual dialogue platform on STI policy exchange and definition of joint STI priorities

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE GLOBAL APPROACH TO RESEARCH AND INNOVATION (R&I)?

To preserve openness in research and innovation international cooperation while promoting a level playing field and reciprocity underpinned by fundamental values.



HOW WILL THIS BE ACHIEVED?

Modulating bilateral cooperation in line with European interests and values and EU's open strategic autonomy.

Accelerating sustainable and inclusive development, and the transition to resilient, knowledge-based societies and economies in low and middle-income countries.

Using a *Team Europe* approach, with actions by the EU, its financial institutions and Member States.

Africa Initiative

In the first Work Programme of Horizon Europe 2021-2022



- Immediate outcome of the first ever EU-AU R&I Ministerial (July 2020), it will strengthen long-term cooperation in finding solutions to enhance global public health, socio-economic development and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic.
- A total budget of ~350 MEUR through 36 topics under calls for proposals targeted at EU-Africa R&I cooperation, responding to four joint policy priorities:
 - 1. Public Health (40 MEUR) 📵
 - 2. Green Transition (215 MEUR)
 - 3. Innovation & Technology (11 MEUR)
 - 4. Capacities for Science (91.9 MEUR)
- Adoption of Horizon Europe Work Programme: 16 June 2021 (EU funding & tenders' portal).



Examples of successful EU-AU R&I Partnerships I



Public Health

The European and Developing Countries Clinical Trials Partnership (EDCTP), with joint investment of 1.4 BEUR and its efforts to gear research towards COVID-19 (e.g. clinical research networks). Currently approaching its third cycle of funding.



Green Transition

- R&I Partnership on Food Nutrition Security and Sustainable Agriculture (FNSSA) channeled a joint investment of 381 MEUR on four priorities:
 - 1) Sustainable intensification;
 - 2) Agriculture and food systems for nutrition;
 - 3) Expansion and improvement of agricultural trade and markets;
 - 4) Cross-cutting topics.

Long-Term Joint European Union - African Union Research and Innovation Partnership on Renewable Energy

- 83 partners, of which 39 from Africa, total budget 32.55 MEUR
- Topic 'Accelerating the green transition and energy access Partnership with Africa', part of the EU Green Deal call under H2020
 - Innovation Action, focus on demonstrating renewable energy solutions, the
 5 selected projects currently in process of commencing operations
 - Total budget of 50,68 MEUR, leveraging significant finances of African participants, and public/private entities



Examples of successful EU/AU R&I partnerships IV



Strong Engagement

- 1000+ stakeholders from 50+ countries
- 44 core Tech hubs, 100 tech hubs in total
- 200+ Start-ups/Entrepreneurs engaged
- 60 TTOs

Strong Collaboration:

- Collaborations with AU, AFDB, DG CNECT, INTPA, NEAR, EIB, National Governments
- New official Innovation Working Group under the High-Level Policy Dialogue
- Thematic partners in our priority areas: Agriculture, CleanTech, MedTech, and Digital as a crosscutting theme

Visible impacts

- 30+ partnerships concluded
- First joint projects received external funding
- Successful thematic challenges on med-tech (Covid) and clean-tech organized.
- 200+ innovation stakeholders received training on access to funding, venture capital, H2020 funding, business model development, female entrepreneurship, corporate innovation etc.

Towards a joint EU-AU Innovation Agenda

- To enhance the impact of R&I on socio-economic development and job creation, a joint EU-AU Innovation Agenda was proposed during the first EU-AU R&I Ministerial meeting of July 2020.
- This will come in addition to the 'Africa Initiative', with the aim to translate R&I efforts into positive impacts on the ground, to yield sustainable growth and jobs, and to develop a long-term and sustainable operational EU-AU R&I cooperation model.
- Comprehensive 'innovation agenda' including 3 main pillars:
 - a) Coordination and communication, outreach and networking across the EU and AU
 - b) Capacity-building and business creation
 - c) Provision of incubation and acceleration services, including financial support



Next steps

- Council Conclusions on Global Approach to R&I invite COM to prepare an EU/AU Innovation Agenda
- Included in final communication of EU/AU MFA Ministerial meeting of EU/AU of 25/26 October
- First draft Innovation Agenda under preparation, to be finalised by December 2021
- Stakeholder consultation in early 2022, EU/AU R&I SOM to conclude and endorse Innovation Agenda
- Presentation of Innovation Agenda at EU/AU Summit in February 2022
- Side event on EU/AU R&I cooperation under consideration during Summit, aiming to link young
 African and European innovators, tech hubs and incubators
