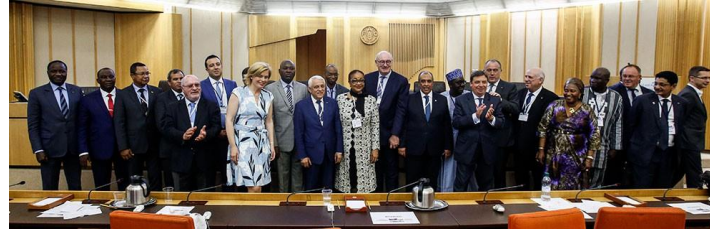

Raison d'être

- **Strengthening the EU's partnership with Africa.** A new Africa-Europe Alliance for Sustainable Investments and Job
- **Task Force Rural Africa**
An Africa-Europe Agenda for Rural Transformation
- Conducting research on economic analysis of policies concerning Africa's **agri-food system**.

Material & Methods

- **Economy-wide economic models:** General Equilibrium Models (MAGNET & DEMETRA)
- **Micro-level economic models:** Farm-household Model (FSSIM-Dev)
- **Integration of micro and macro-level models**
- **Survey and Data analyses**

Objectives

- **Foster scientific communities** with independent, evidence-based scientific support, data/information, on the economic analysis of agrifood sectors and related policies
- **Support African policy makers** on designing policies assessing ex-ante economic
- **Serve as a platform** for knowledge sharing, data, models/tools, coding and modelling skills, and simulation results and creating a common knowledge base and practices
- **Help to enhance food and nutrition security**, as in the Malabo Declaration - ending hunger in Africa by 2025, and SDG2 - Zero Hunger

Economy-wide studies

- **Modelling agri-food and related policies in Africa**
 - Impacts of AfCFTA on agri-food sectors at continental, regional and country level.
 - Impact of Covid-19 in Ethiopia and Kenya.
 - Agricultural policy reforms in Senegal and Kenya.
 - Rural job opportunity creation in Ethiopia.
 - Fiscal policy in agricultural in Senegal.
 - Impacts of Cocoa LID price mechanism
- **Collecting evidence and data analysis**
 - Development and maintenance of national databases apt for modelling for Kenya 2017, Ethiopia, Senegal, Ghana, and Cote d'Ivoire.

Micro-economic studies

- **Modelling agricultural policies in Africa**
 - Impact of subsidies in Senegal and Tanzania
 - Small irrigation in Niger
 - Support to animal mechanization in cotton farming in Côte d'Ivoire
 - Impacts of Cocoa LID price mechanism
- **Collecting evidence and data analysis**
 - Survey on sustainable practices in the cocoa supply chain in Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana
 - Survey on the impacts of fertilizer subsidies in Senegal
 - Governance of large irrigation perimeters in Niger
 - Crowdsourcing staple food price data gathering in Nigeria (*cooperation with IITA*)

Integrated studies

- Living Income Differential Cocoa in Ghana and Côte d'Ivoire
 - **Global PE:** global market and price effects → **CGE: country-wide and sectoral effects**, deforestation in GHA and CIV → **FSSIM-DEV: farmers' incomes, poverty**
- Trade liberalization within the AfCFTA: effects on African countries
 - Global CGE: tariff & NTM liberalization on food trade → country-level CGE: food security, labour market, household incomes in Kenya. Also potentially: Impacts on farmers' incomes, poverty, in Ghana, Ethiopia, Côte d'Ivoire
- Impacts of COVID-19 on African countries
 - CGE models for Ethiopia and Kenya: macro and sectoral effects → microsimulation: poverty, nutrition

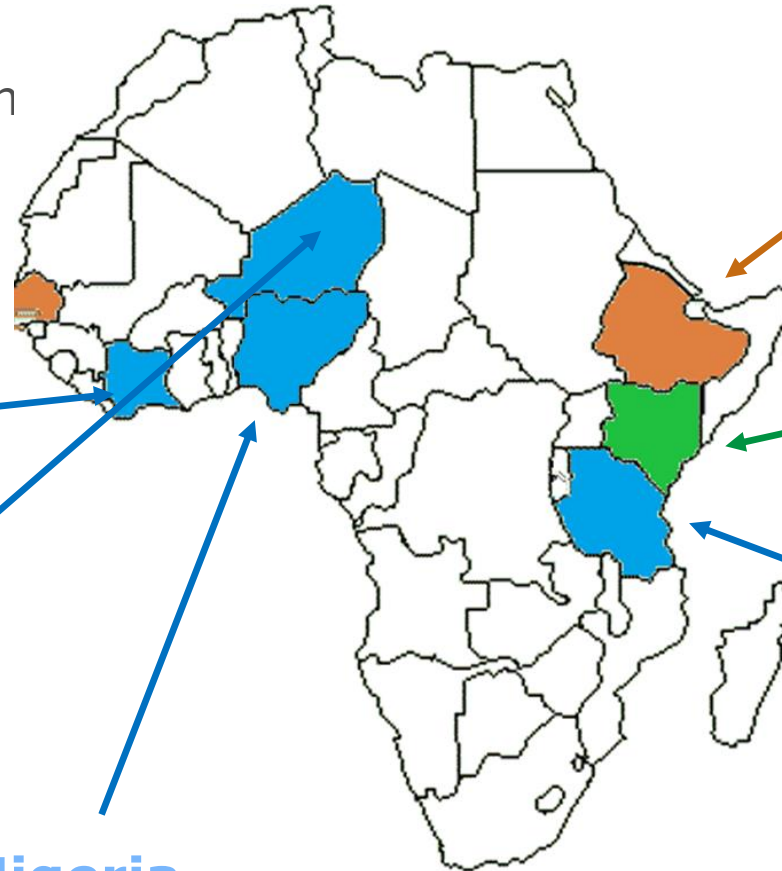
