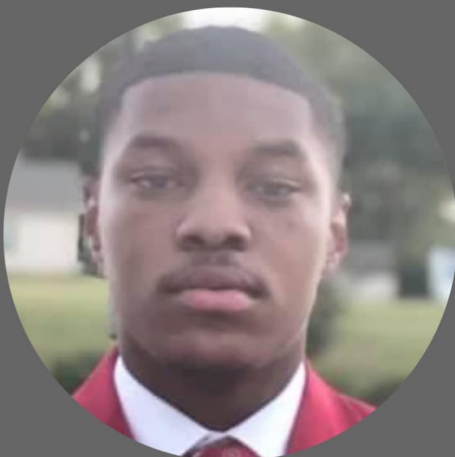

Any council member interested in running for an elected position to the National Pre- Alumni Council Executive Board must submit an electronic application packet via the Google Form link provided, by Sunday, February 6, 2022 at 11:59 p.m.
NPAC 2022-2023 Elections Application Form

Application Packets must include:

1. Online Application (Google Form)
2. A letter of Recommendation from the PAC Advisor/Institutional Advancement rep or PAC President (most desirably typed and signed) on letterhead.
3. Official/Unofficial Transcript
4. Resume
5. Bio (Not to exceed 250 words) with an attached Head Shot
6. Answer the questions listed within this application

Each applicant must have a 2.8 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale as of February 6, 2022. This will be verified by your transcript, which is to be included in your application packet. The NPAC President will send a letter via email upon receipt of your packet allowing you to campaign via Social Media. NPAC representatives will notify candidates when they can campaign. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action.

Council members who desire to run for any position must meet the electronic mailing deadline.

PLEASE REVIEW ARTICLES III, IV, V, AND VI IN THE NPAC CONSTITUTION FOR MORE INFORMATION CONCERNING QUALIFICATIONS, DUTIES AND PROCEDURES FOR ELECTIONS.

** Only one person from a member institution may serve in an elected position and no more than two persons from a member institution may serve in appointed positions. ** This does not prevent two individuals from running for an elected position from the same institution but if both win, one will need to step down. The PAC Advisor assists with the decision.

Criteria For National Pre-Alumni Council Awards

All applications will be evaluated based on the following set requirements: grammar, creativity, originality, clarity and content. All applications will be voted on by the NPAC Board under the leadership of the National Business Manager. The deadline for all award applications will be Sunday February 6, 2021, unless stated otherwise. Applications must be submitted electronically to uncf.npac@gmail.com

Barbara Marshall PAC of the Year

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page (2 page max), double-spaced, typed essay entitled: My PAC is the PAC of the Year. What makes your PAC stand out? The essay should discuss active membership numbers, participation in the national conference, completed programs/events for the year based on NPAC initiatives, projected events for the second semester, and any other outstanding or noteworthy accomplishments.
- Evaluative Considerations: Overall contributions made by your PAC and outstanding and noteworthy accomplishments.

PAC Advisor of the Year

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page (2 page max), double-spaced, typed essay on the nominee entitled: (Nominee's Name): PAC Advisor of the Year. The biography should outline the contributions the advisor has made to the local, regional, and/or national council. The essay should state any improvements of the local council, its membership, and fundraising that can be directly linked to the advisor. Moreover, any membership highlights, fundraising improvements, and outstanding contribution to the PAC.
- Evaluative Considerations: Overall contribution of the advisor as discussed in the essay.

Most Improved PAC of the Year

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page (2 page max), double-spaced, typed essay describing the magnitude of the improvement made by the corresponding Pre-Alumni Council. The essay should state improvement in the following areas: membership, campus involvement, community involvement, etc.
- Evaluative Considerations: This award will be presented to the PAC that has made the most improvement in several areas from the previous academic school year.

PAC Member of the Year

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page (2 page max.), double-spaced, typed essay describing the involvement of the student in their respective PAC as well as any other significant contributions or attending events held by the organization and going beyond the call of duty as a member.
- Evaluative Considerations: Overall contributions of the member as discussed in the essay.

PAC President of the Year

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page typed entitled: PAC President of the Year: President's Name. This essay should thoroughly describe the accomplishments and exemplary leadership skills demonstrated by the presidential nominee during his or her reign. The essay should also include details about the significant contributions the nominee has made to the organization.
- Evaluative Considerations: Overall contribution of the PAC President as discussed in the essay.

Chase L. Gayden Exemplary Leadership Award

Requirements:

- Applicants should submit a 1 page (2 page max.), double-spaced, typed essay: Exemplary Leadership an Example Set from NAC to NPAC. The essay should describe the demonstration of the following attributes of quality leadership on a regular basis:
 - Ability to motivate self and others - Creativity - Collaboration - Integrity
 - Balance
 - The student MUST be nominated
 - The student nominated must be present during the presentation of the NPAC Awards at the National Conference.

SERVICE WITH FOOD BANKS & SCHOOL PANTRY'S

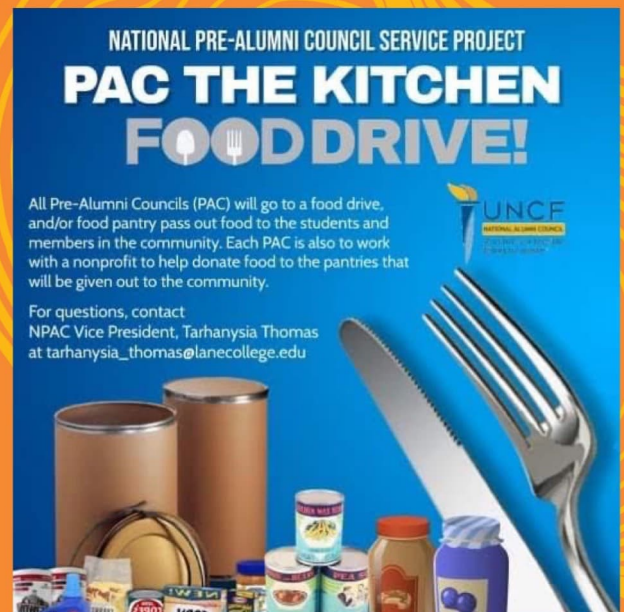
REQUIREMENTS: This event should be done at least once in a calendar school year 2021-2022.

PROOF: Each PAC must document with a picture or a letter from the nonprofit you received the goods from, and also from the food bank you did your service with.

REWARD: The PAC that reports the most number of goods they have given at the UNCF NAC/NPAC national conference will receive the NPAC "Giving Back" award for their service and commitment to the community.

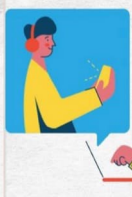

NPAC VIRTUAL FUNDRAISING COMPETITION

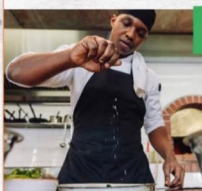

WITHOUT FUNDRAISING, PACS WOULD HAVE NO INCOMING REVENUE. DON'T STRESS, WITH THIS GUIDE YOU WILL HAVE THE FUNDAMENTALS TO HAVE A SEAMLESS, STRESS-FREE FUNDRAISER IN NO TIME!

VIRTUAL BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP

For this virtual fundraiser the PAC may choose to partner with a local business to offer a virtual instruction. For example a local restaurant owner could have a chef that he will allow to host a cooking class with the PAC, or a local aesthetician may do a class of making face masks or lip scrubs. The course could be about anything as long as the advisor approves of course and proper protocol has been implemented when it came to working with people outside of the respective institution. The PAC will of course have an entry for this event that will be collected prior to the event to ensure that those who have paid will have the link.

MAINTAINING GOOD CREDIT

Pay credit card balances strategically

30%

The portion of your credit limits you're using at any given time is called your credit utilization. A good guideline: Use less than 30% of your limit on any card, and lower is better. The highest scorers use less than 7%.

Pay bills on time



Late payments can stay on your credit reports for 7+ years. Your record of paying bills on time is the largest scoring factor in both FICO and VantageScore credit scoring systems.

Ask for higher credit limits



once the higher limit is reported to credit bureaus, it will lower your overall credit utilization – as long as you don't use up the extra "room" on the card.

Dispute credit report errors

A mistake on one of your credit reports could be pulling down your score. Fixing it can help you quickly improve your credit
