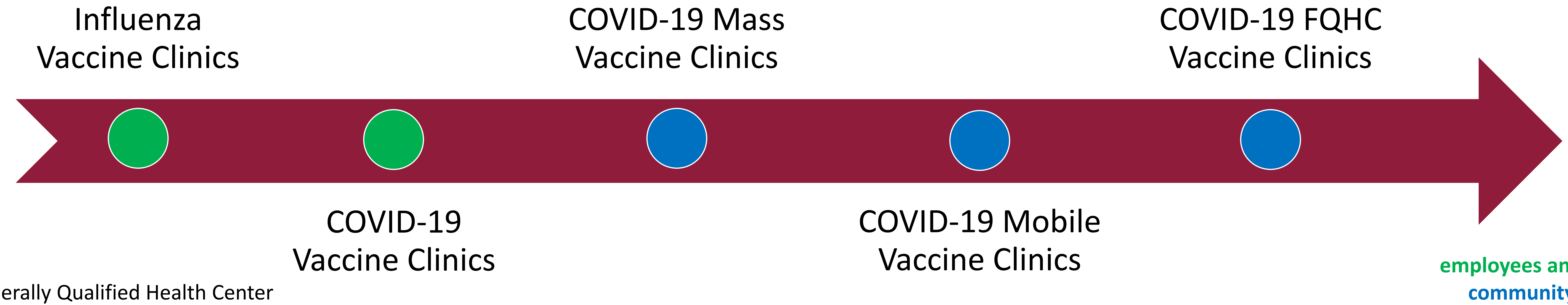

Influenza Vaccine Clinics

Collaborated with Student and Employee Health and School of Nursing

25 vaccine clinics

September and October 2020

Vaccinated 1,824 students and 1,125 employees

COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics

Collaborated with Employee Health and the Schools of Medicine and Nursing

43 vaccine clinics

December 2020 through February 2021

Provided 20,365 vaccines to students and employees

COVID-19 Mass Vaccine Clinics

Collaborated with Schools of Nursing, Medicine, Dentistry, Allied Health, Public Health, Behavioral Health, and Religion

Provided 79,775 vaccinations to community members (23% Latino/LatinX and 20% Asian)

January through May 2021

COVID-19 Mobile Vaccine Clinics

Provided 2,124 vaccinations to community members

Focused on Black (38%) and Latino/LatinX (54%) communities

93% returned for second dose

February through July 2021

COVID-19 FQHC Vaccine Clinics

Provided 2,261 vaccinations to community members

93% returned for second dose

February and March 2021

CONCLUSIONS

Students, residents, fellows, faculty, staff, and alumni of Loma Linda University School of Pharmacy were actively involved in mass influenza and COVID-19 vaccinations for healthcare professionals, students, and community members, including those of underserved populations.
