- 5. Believing it's easier to cheat online
- 6. Not engaging actively and regularly
- 7. Losing motivation

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STEPS TO ONLINE SUCCESS

- 1. Ask God for persistence and patience in learning how to study online.
- 2. Attend class with purpose, paying attention and acting on every instruction.
- 3. Set a fixed time to study each day.
- 4. Ask questions and engage professors.

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- 5. Connect with other students.
- 6. Hold yourself accountable.
