After 38 years in ministry, the Biblical-based conviction slowly grew that discipleship is the loving responsibility of those with a generation of experience. The basic currency of support for this discipleship ministry isn't money. This ministry operates on something even more valuable than our currency. The resource of investment is time: time for those who disciple and for those who are disciplined.

THIS INVALUABLE RESOURCE OF TIME IS SHARED IN FOUR CATEGORIES:

His Time - time in Bible teaching, instructing, encouraging, rebuking, learning and growing together.

Your Time - time for questions about life, work, family, and community as these relate to the Bible.

Their Time - time to develop talents for more ministry to the community, church, family, and the world.

Prayer Time - time to pray for fitness, direction, strength, courage, healing, through the infilling of the Holy Spirit.

Discipleship:

Being Yourself for Jesus

The goal of teaching discipleship is helping people to disciple others. The way to disciple others is learn how to be yourself, the person that God made you to be, for Jesus. As Alejandro Bullon says in Sharing Jesus is Everything:

"What you need to do is simply be yourself in the transformed life Jesus clothes you with. Carry on with all your daily activities, but with the enriched purpose of sharing the same good news with others that brought peace to your own heart. You don't have to separate blocks of additional time from your already loaded agenda in order to do "missionary work". Essentially, you simply shine with the light of Jesus while interacting with your friends and relatives, neighbors and colleagues. You are simply being yourself. That's all."

And that's it—disciple! Dedicated individuals sharing Christ in personal life experiences.

Goal of Disciple:

To tap into the spiritual resources of experienced men and women in ministry, who will instruct those who would like to be disciplined in practical instruction for sharing Christ in life's experiences.



SUGGESTIONS FOR VARIOUS WAYS THAT YOU CAN DISCIPLE

Personal, one-on-one or group:

In person through a home Bible study, church Sabbath school (like a pastors class), a break time at work, a class session at a school.

One-on-one or group time:

Through FaceTime, zoom or by phone.

How much time:

The amount of time invested is flexible as is the focus of each session. A 30-60 minute investment could split the time by four, spending 7-15 minutes in each category, or more time in any category as the Spirit leads.

One session per week or every other week or more, depending on the particular arrangement. One discipleship class began with a weekly schedule of four days a week, four hours a day (45 minute sessions with 15 minute breaks). After six months, the sessions went from four to two days a week, then six months later to one day a week.

Another discipleship focus connects with individuals and groups once per week for 30-60 minutes a day.

Materials for discipleship:

The main resource for this discipleship is the Bible. Studying through one book of the Bible is recommended. One of the four gospels, Corinthians, Hebrews, even Daniel and Revelation. Any Bible book in which there is interest or practical discipleship opportunity.
