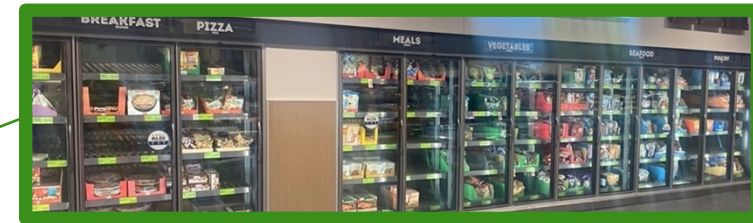
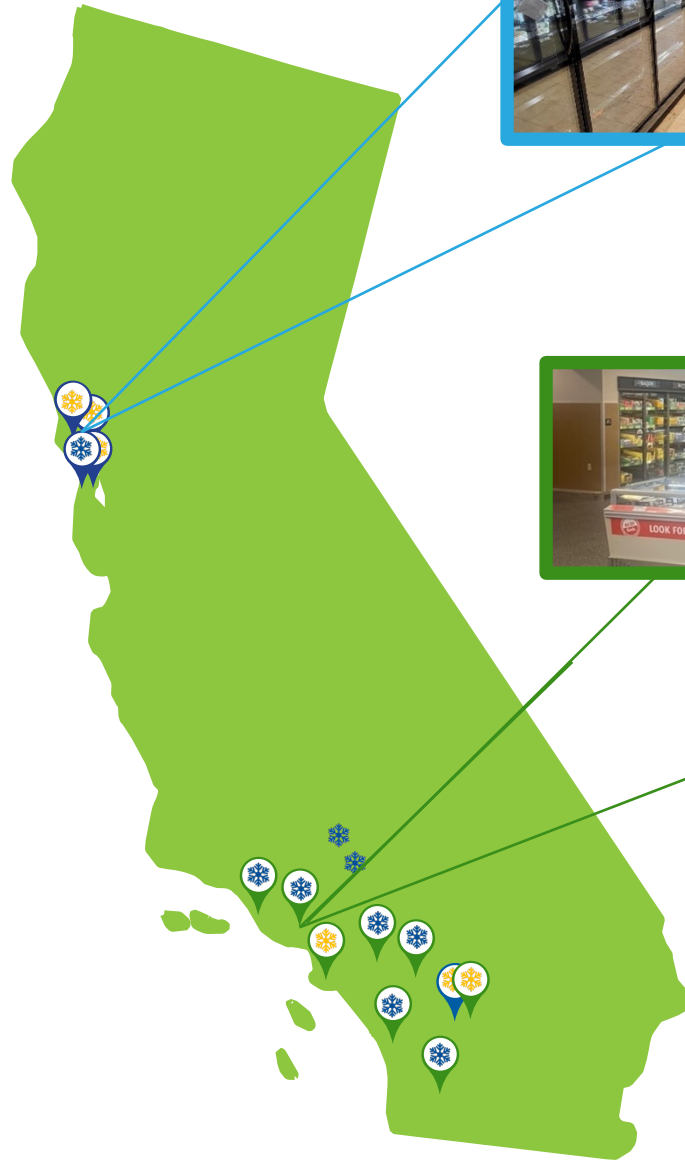

FRIP 2019-2020 Funding

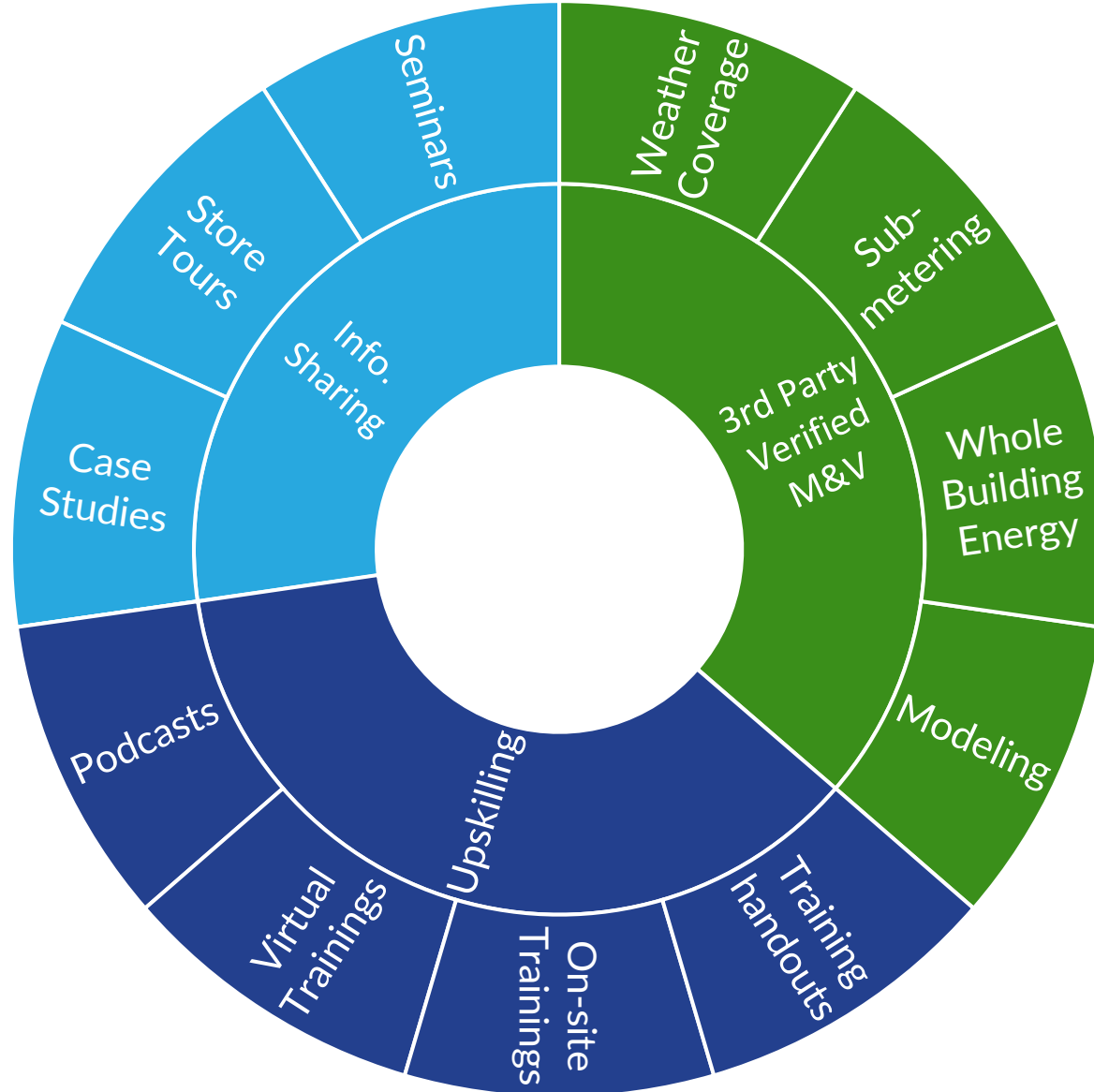
CARB received \$1 Million in 2019-2020

- ❄️ 15 funded projects
- ❄️ 9 located in a census tract identified as disadvantaged or low-income
- 📍 13 ultra-low-GWP technologies

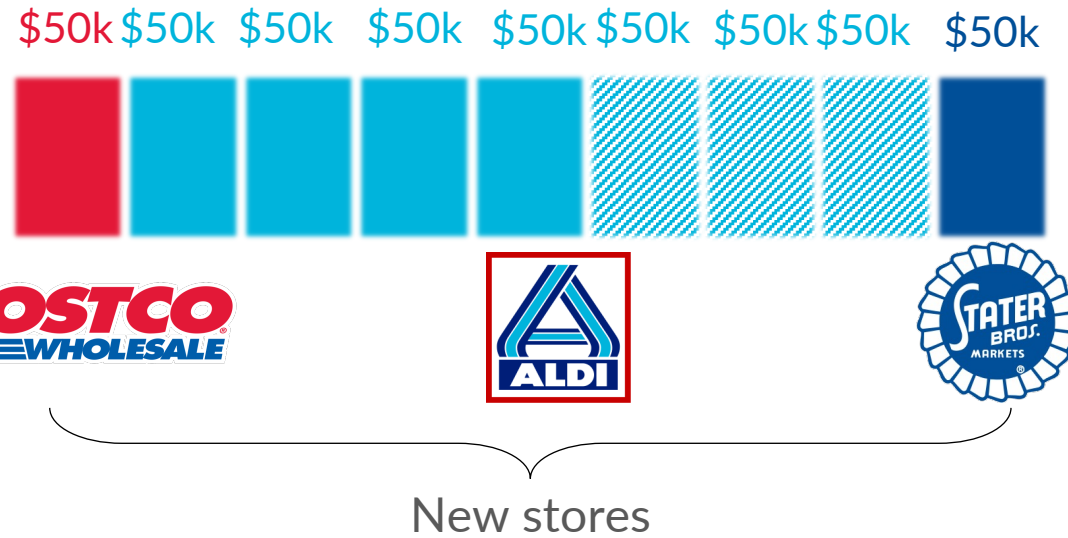

Stater Bros. Markets opened the company's first CO₂ refrigeration system across fleet of 171 stores



Whole Foods Markets converted four existing high-GWP HFC systems to hybrid lower-GWP HFC and CO₂ systems in while keeping the stores operational



Costco opened a store in Murietta with the largest transcritical CO₂ system

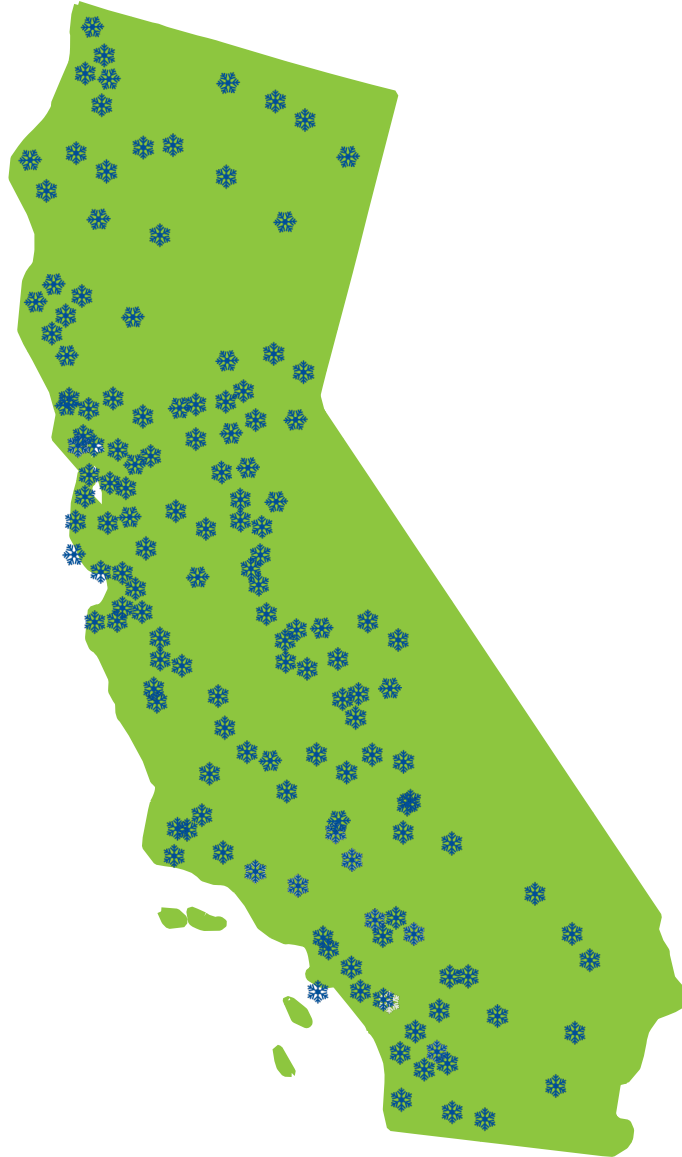

\$65 Million in 2022-24

The CA legislature allocated significant funding to CARB to reduce HFCs

- \$45 million 2022-23
- \$20 million 2023-24



CARB will facilitate a **public stakeholder process** to spend new allocation

- Expand existing FRIP
- Include other HFC refrigerant sources

California's future



California passes **SB 1206 (2022)**:

- Prohibits the sale of newly produced HFCs/HFC blends that exceed a GWP threshold; reclaimed allowed
- CARB to develop assessment to transition to ultra-low and no-GWP technologies by 2035

Reducing HFC emissions is important to achieve **Carbon Neutrality in CA**
