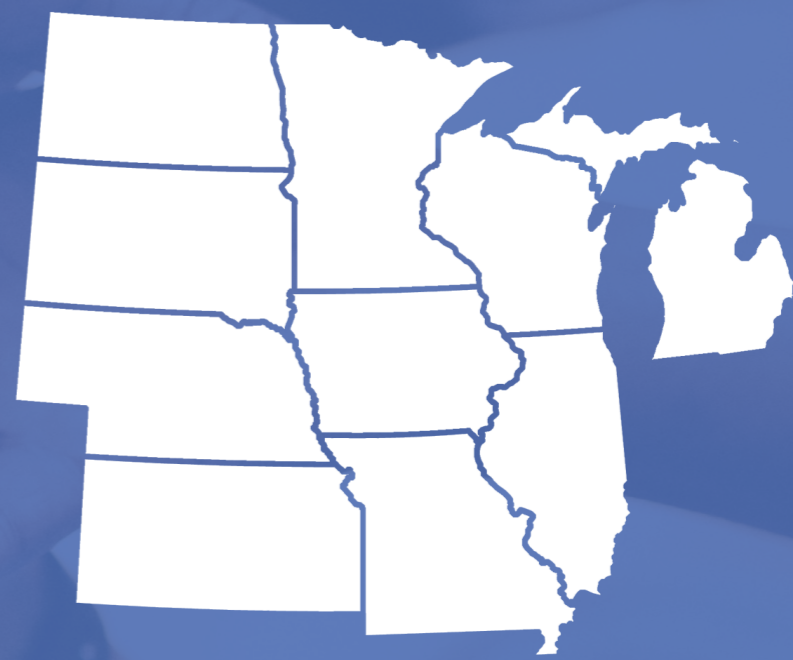

### Facts About Kidney Disease

**African Americans** are **3.6** times more likely to have kidney failure.

**Hispanic Americans and Native Americans** are almost twice as likely to develop kidney failure



when compared with the general population.

**Racial Minorities** have a higher risk of progressing from CKF to ESRD more rapidly.



They are also less likely to receive a kidney transplant.
