Title of Workshop: Quality Assurance for FETPs

Background:

All FETPs are encouraged to maintain a focus on continuous quality improvement. This can be approached from different vantage points:

-from the vantage point of meeting accepted quality standards (program level)

-from the vantage point of improving the monitoring of participant/resident work products (program and participant level)

-from the vantage point of reporting on quality indicators (program level)

-from the vantage point of internal and external evaluation (program level).

Workshop Goal:

The goal of this workshop is to familiarize participants with the available opportunities for quality assurance and improvement of FETPs, and encourage participants to take advantage of them. Four of these will be covered in this workshop.

- 1. Internal and external program evaluation.
- 2. Resident-Driven Project Tracking Tool (ReDPeTT) to monitor resident progress
- 3. AFENET Star rating system
- 4. Accreditation, against internationally recognized quality standards.

Workshop Objectives:

The participants will be able to identify the quality improvement opportunities that best meet their own program's needs, and know how to access or participate in these opportunities and how to best allocate staff to them.
