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Health IT Modernization Executive Summary

To fulfill its mission to deliver comprehensive healthcare across Indian Country, IHS will provide an enterprise Electronic Health Record system to tribes, urban Indian organizations, and IHS sites of care

- IHS provides comprehensive healthcare to American Indian and Alaska Native people to raise their physical, mental, social, and spiritual health to the highest level
- Health Information Technology (IT), including the Electronic Health Record (EHR), is critical infrastructure for every aspect of healthcare
- This infrastructure must be modernized the legacy Resource and Patient Management System (RPMS) is nearly 40 years old, outdated, and unsustainable
- The Health IT Modernization Program will
 - Replace RPMS with modern, industry-leading, health IT and EHR solutions deployed and managed on an enterprise level
 - Stabilize the support system through an enterprise approach that includes staff training, business processes, and technology maintenance
 - Liberate data so it is accessible across the enterprise by clinicians, patients, and partners alike to improve patient outcomes
- Modernization will support all of Indian country sovereign tribes will determine whether they participate in the IHS enterprise solution or adopt their own
- Health IT Modernization is a 10-year initiative that will be transformational in its impacts nationwide



Need for Health IT Modernization

After system-wide analysis along with Tribal Consultations and Urban Confers, the IHS determined to fully replace RPMS in order to fulfill its mission

People

- Patients need better interoperability and communication among their health care providers, and access to their own health information
- Providers and other users surveyed during the IHS Health IT Modernization Research Project overwhelmingly favored deploying new health information technology – 93%
- Partners throughout the consultation/confer process, no tribal or urban partners have raised objections to moving away from RPMS

Process

- The legacy model for development and support of RPMS is unsustainable
- The workforce needed to support hundreds of independent RPMS databases in the field does not exist

Technology

- The IHS is not a software development organization and does not have the depth or agility to respond to an ever-changing technology and regulatory environment
- The underlying code base for RPMS is outdated, and there are few developers capable of supporting it
- Office of Inspector General (OIG), Government Accountability Office (GAO), and IHS' own research called out an urgent need to modernize our health IT infrastructure

Procurement

While procurement is an inherently federal function, the IHS actively sought ways to include tribal leaders and tribal health systems in the process

- Third-party research validated the technical issue
 - U.S. Government Accountability Office Report 19-471 listed RPMS as a "critical federal legacy system in need of modernization"
 - Two HHS Office of the Inspector General reports offered ways to improve systems (A-18-16-30540 and A-18-17-11400)
- IHS obtained industry input through two Requests for Information
 - Held Industry Day with 300+ attendees from 193 companies and organizations
 - Invited comments on draft Statement of Objectives and draft Sample Task
 Order for future Request for Proposal
- IHS released a Dear Tribal and Urban Leader Letters(DTLL/DUIOLL) with associated listening sessions held by the IHS in December 2020 with request for comments leading to the April 2021 announcement to replace RPMS with a commercial product
- A DTLL/DUIOLL <u>announcing Program updates</u> and asking for written feedback to the RFI containing the Statement of Objectives in August 2021
- Tribal participation in enterprise EHR vendor demonstrations generated 30,000 data elements that informed the current acquisition process
